Dr Harold Schulman was that change and more – a physician, teacher, mentor, researcher, leader, friend, family man, truly a citizen of the World... The humanity lost a great one. He passed away on September 17, 2016 at the age of 87 surrounded by family at his home in Pleasantville, New York, USA. As a pioneering physician, Dr Schulman is considered the grandfather of maternal and fetal ultrasound in the USA. He always took a challenge to improve health for women, uncompromising in a quest for science and better medicine. He was a professor and chairman of Obstetrics/Gynecology (OB/GYN) Department at Albert Einstein College of Medicine in New York and Winthrop University Hospital on Long Island, major teaching affiliate of the State University of New York at Stony Brook. During his tenure at Einstein for 12 years, he oversaw academic OB/GYN Department and four New York City hospitals: Jacobi Medical Center, Lincoln Medical Center, Montefiore Medical Center, and Bronx Lebanon Hospital Center. He was a candidate for Rhodes Scholar. He published over 185 scientific papers and three books on women health. He thought and mentored generations of OB/GYN physicians, many from different corners of the world, and this is his most vibrant legacy. Dr Schulman was a resident of Vero Beach and Hutchinson Island for 30 years and is survived by his wife Rosemarie, children Stanley Harold Schulman of Bedford, NY, Sandra Carol Schulman of Miami, FL, Gina Marin Schulman Riback of Los Angeles, CA, and grandson Miles Joseph Riback. To celebrate his life, we will continue to carry the torch to be light and inspiration for women health. This was and continue to be Harold Schulman...
